# OPPOSED LENZ TO AUTONOMY

ATTEMPTS by the Johannesburg City Council to "foist" civic autonomy on Lenasia were rejected in the strongest possible terms by the sprawling township's leaders this week.

Leading the attack on the autonomy concept is 25-year-old Mr. Ebrahim Saloojee, youngest member of the six-man Lenasia Management Committee.

Mr. Saloojee is also chairman of the Lenasia Cultural League and a member of the secretariat of the all-race Social Democratic Movement.

"Our standpoint is quite unequivocal," Mr. Saloojee told POST: "We want non-racial integration at all levels. We want direct representation for all on the town and city councils of the land, on the provincial councils and in parliament."

He said that he and his colleagues were merely using the LMC as a platform to propagate their views on non-racialism.

However, he said that under certain circumstances autonomy could be considered if the authorities opened consolidated Lenasia to all races.

Meanwhile, at last week's meeting of the LMC the committee voted to accept more powers. Mr. Saloojee and his brother, Dr. R. A. M. Saloojee, the chairman, were not present at the meeting.

## Anger at car danger

POST Correspondent THE Eldorado Park Extension Two Rate-payers and Tenants Committee have condemned the recent car accidents in the OFS-bound main driveway opposite their area, as a "calculus disregard of human life, by the authorities who planned the township".

The reason for their anger, "Well," said a committee spokesman, "we are just sick and tired of the spate of recent accidents. Resident bus commuters are injured by fast moving cars, because there are no pedestrian-crossing signs or a turn road which leads into the township."

"Last week, two ladies were hit by a speeding car as they crossed the road after alighting from a bus. Both of them are in Coronation Hospital in serious conditions."

"A month before that it was a 12-year-old boy, who was smashed into as he crossed the road. There is a curve before the unmarked bus stop and cars come flying along as if the road were a race-track," said the spokesman.

His committee will approach the city council.
